

Message From Our Pastor

THE NEED FOR THE ROSARY

I would like to continue to encourage our parishioners to become devoted to the rosary; to make the rosary part of their daily prayer routine, to become part of our communal Marian Devotion on Wednesdays, and to become beneficiaries of the promises that our Blessed Mother has made with regards to the rosary.

Here are the promises of our Blessed Mother about praying the rosary as revealed to St. Dominic and Blessed Alan de la Roche:

- 1. Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall receive powerful
- 2. I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary.
- The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell, it will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies.
- 4. It will cause virtue and good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw the hearts of people from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire of eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.
- 5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall not perish.
 6. Whoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying Himself to the consideration of its Sacred Mysteries shall never be conquered by misfortune. God will not chastise Him in His justice, he shall not perish by an unprovided death; if he be just, he shall remain in the grace of God, and
- become worthy of eternal life. Whoever shall have a true devotion for the Rosary shall not die without the Sacraments of the Church.
- Those who are faithful to recite the Rosary shall have during their life and at their death the light of God and the plentitude of His graces; at the moment of death they shall participate in the merits of the Saints in Paradise.
- 9. I shall deliver from purgatory those who have been devoted to the Rosary.
- 10. The faithful children of the Rosary shall merit a high degree of glory in Heaven.
- 11. You shall obtain all you ask of me by the recitation of the Rosary.
- 12. All those who propagate the Holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.
- 13. I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire celestial court during their life and at the hour of death.
- 14. All who recite the Rosary are my children, and brothers and sisters of my only Son, Jesus
- 15. Devotion of my Rosary is a great sign of predestination.



ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2020 LENTEN REGULATIONS

 The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of **18 and 59** are obliged to fast.

On the day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obligated by the law of abstinence.

- The obligation to observe the law of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- The time for fulfilling the Pascal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 1, 2020 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 7, 2020

*Canon 920, 1. All faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.
