

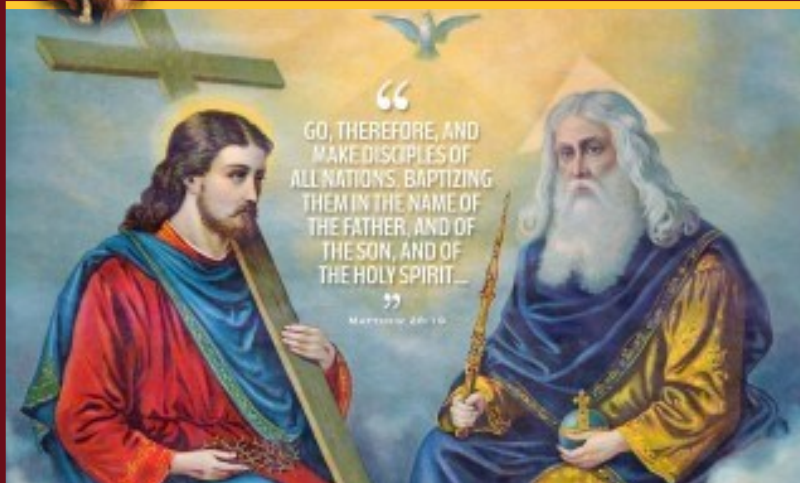

Message From The Pastors Desk



NEW DIRECTIVES AND UPDATES FOR LITURGICAL CELEBRATIONS IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK

The Archdiocese has issued new and updated guidelines for liturgical celebrations in the Archdiocese of Newark. Here is the summary of the guidelines and how we, as a parish, will stay in compliance to these directives.

Effective May 28,

- * Wearing masks will no longer be required for fully vaccinated persons. If not fully vaccinated, persons are strongly encouraged to follow CDC guidance and wear a face mask in public settings.
- * People will no longer be required to socially distance, both indoors and outdoors, although unvaccinated persons should continue to maintain a safe distance from others.

Effective June 4,

- * All indoor and outdoor gathering limits will be removed.
 - * Churches and parish facilities may return to 100 per cent capacity with no social distancing for both indoor and outdoor services and activities.
 - * Vaccinated parishioners are not required to wear a mask, in Church, but are free to do so and no proof of vaccination is required.
 - * Anyone not fully vaccinated should wear a mask.
 - * Churches and meeting spaces should continue to be sanitized after each liturgy, event or meeting.
- Parishes are no longer required to register people for Mass, but have the option of doing so.

Effective June 5/6, 2021, (Regarding Mass Attendance)

On this date, the Solemnity of the Most Precious Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, Cardinal Tobin and the Bishops of New Jersey will reinstate the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. OUR PARISH COMPLIANCE TO THESE DIRECTIVES

- * Beginning from the evening Mass on June 5th, 2021, parishioners will no longer be required to sign in for Mass attendance, no physical distancing will be required, and all will be encouraged to wear mask. Mask wearing will be mandated for those who are not fully vaccinated and optional for those who are fully vaccinated.
- * Sprinkling rites will resume with fresh water blessed for each occasion. Holy water will be kept in the dispenser at the Font of Baptism for parishioners to fill their bottles for home use. There will be no Holy Water in the bowls at the back of the Church.
- We will return to in-pew collections with long-handle baskets. We encourage our parishioners to use the various electronic-giving methods we have put in place in the parish.
- * The gifts of bread and wine, as well as the offertory collection, will be brought forth to the Altar by members of parish during Mass.
- * Sign of the peace will continue to be made without physical contact.
- Communion will continue to be received in one species alone (The Body of Christ) and in the hand.
- Priests, Deacons, and Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist will continue to wear mask during the distribution of communion.
- * We will return to our normal process of receiving communion—come from the central aisle, and re-enter from the side aisles.
- * We will continue to enter the Church from the central aisle and be seated by the Ushers. You may exit the Church from any of the doors.

Music

- Church choir members are to resume singing in the church as a choir. Masks are not required to be worn nor do they need to social distance.
 - * We encourage all our choristers to be vaccinated so that choir members can feel comfortable singing together.
- All musical instruments may now be used.

Hymnals and Bulletins

- * Hymnals and reusable booklets are now permitted for use in our Church.
- * Bulletins and other handouts can be picked up or handed out by our ushers.

Confessions:

- * We will continue to have confessions with the present arrangement to make sure everyone has the comfort level to participate in this important sacrament.

Lectors and Cantors

- * Lectors and cantors who are fully vaccinated do not need to wear a mask.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

- * All Extraordinary Ministers of Communion (and clergy) must sanitize their hands after they themselves consume Communion and before they distribute to the assembly.
- * Fully vaccinated ministers are only required to wear a mask when distributing Communion.

We will continue to livestream our 9am and the 10:30am Masses for those who are ill, or have other serious or contagious illness; those confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; and those with serious underlying health conditions.

My dear parishioners, these new directives are truly welcome news; a return to some semblance of normalcy in our faith practices. We thank God for this development, and we continue to pray that our faith may be made stronger by the events of this past year. With renewed commitment, let us move forward, with confidence, unto that glory that is ours in Christ Jesus. looking forward to seeing all of you back in Church. To God be the glory!

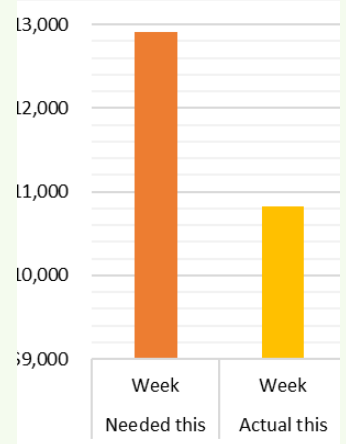

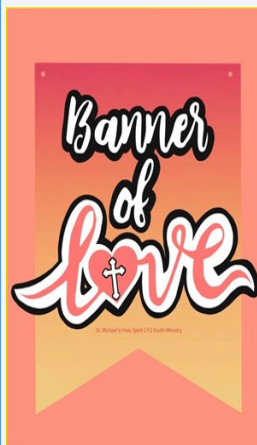

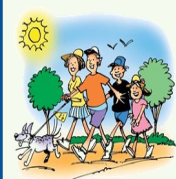

Prayer to St. Michael

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the devil.
